## COSTS AND BENEFITS

**Admission** Admission to programs requires a high school transcript or high school equivalency test scores. Prospective students must complete an application form.

### Tuition and Fees

- \$76.75 per credit hour or \$921 per semester full-time for county residents
- \$93.25 per credit hour or \$1,119 per semester full-time for out-of-county, New Mexico residents
- \$101.75 per credit hour or \$1,221 per semester full-time for non-New Mexico residents who qualify for the 135-Mile rate
- \$245 per credit hour or \$2,940 per semester full-time for all other non-residents.
