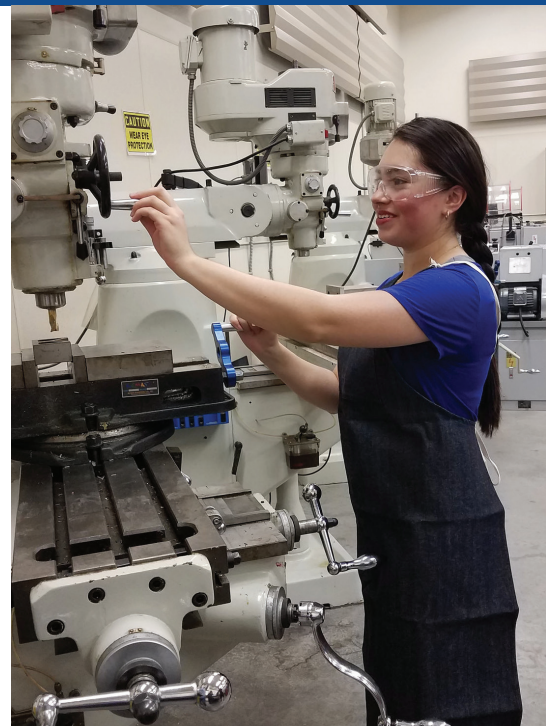

REQUEST TRANSCRIPTS:

First-time college students should request an official high school transcript with their graduation date. A transfer student must request all official college transcripts. All transcripts must be sent directly from the institution to the DACC Admissions Office at admissions@dacc.nmsu.edu.

DIGITAL MEDIA

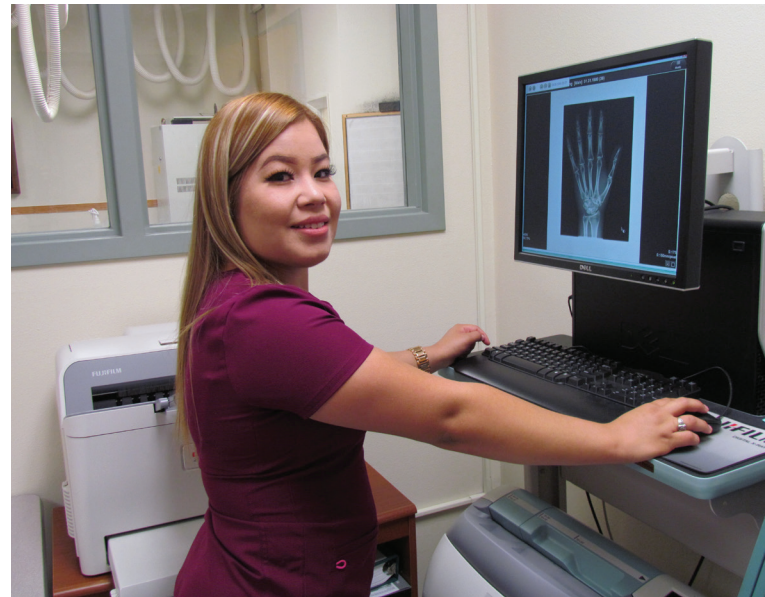

Financial Aid and Scholarships

At Doña Ana Community College, we pride ourselves on being a rigorous yet affordable place to earn an associate degree or certificate. As part of that commitment, we work to provide financial aid to all who need it.

WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE FOR COLLEGE?

GRANTS

Grants are types of financial aid that you do not have to pay back. They are offered by the state and federal government.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are free aid dollars that can be based on financial need or other qualifications. scholarships.nmsu.edu

WORK-STUDY

If you qualify for work-study as part of your aid package, you can find a part-time job on campus to help pay for your school tuition and expenses.

HOW TO QUALIFY FOR FINANCIAL AID

To qualify for financial aid and most of the scholarships, you are required to demonstrate financial need and are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Apply for federal financial aid by submitting your FAFSA, studentaid.gov. DACC's federal school code is **E00876**.

SCHOLARSHIPS

NEW MEXICO LOTTERY SCHOLARSHIP

Students must be a resident of New Mexico, attend a public New Mexico higher education institution, enroll full time within 16 months of high school graduation, and maintain a 2.5 GPA.

OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

Students must be a resident of New Mexico, attend a public New Mexico higher education institution, enroll part-time or full-time, and maintain a 2.5 GPA.

TEXAS 135

Texas 135 is a tuition discount for Texas students enrolling at DACC who live within 135 miles of our Las Cruces Campus. Students should enroll in 12 credits at DACC and must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress. Students meeting these requirements will be eligible for resident out-of-district tuition times 110% in lieu of non-resident tuition. 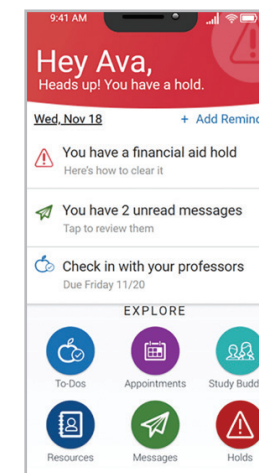
Tools for Academic Advising

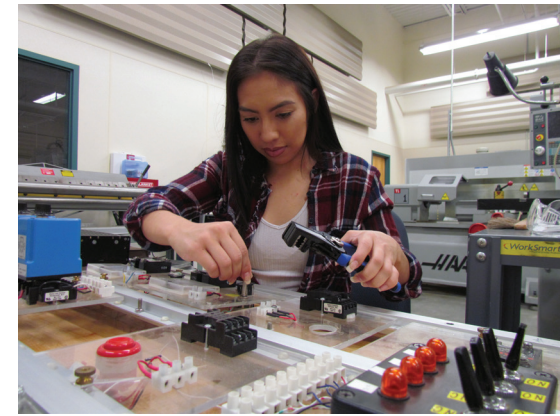
