Semester-Cycle Model

Overview: In this model, counselors create lists every semester of the students that will be taking Dual Credit courses the next semester. The list of participating students will be shared with the DACC Dual Credit Team to coordinate the following processes: Dual Credit Application, Dual Credit Orientation, Academic Advising & Registration. (Please check <u>DACC Dual Credit Important Dates</u> for deadlines)

New Incoming DC Students: Students that have not yet been admitted to DACC Dual Credit.

Will have to complete the following:

- Dual Credit Application
- Dual Credit Orientation
- Academic Advising Meeting
- Registration

Continuing DC Students: Students that are considered "active students": Are either taking a class or took a class this past semester.

Will have to complete the following:

- Academic Advising Meeting
- Registration

Will NOT have to complete the following:

- Dual Credit Application
- Dual Credit Orientation

Readmitted DC Students (Uncommon): Students that are considered "non-active students": Took a Dual Credit course and was inactive for two or more semesters (didn't take a DC course or dropped courses during that time):

Will have to complete the following:

- Dual Credit Application
- Academic Advising Meeting
- Registration

Will NOT have to complete the following:

Dual Credit Orientation

Expectations

- DACC-Dual Credit students are only allowed to take 1 Dual Credit course during their first semester in Dual Credit. Upon successful completion of the first semester (C- or better), the student will be able to take up to two Dual Credit courses course.
- DACC-Dual Credit students are only allowed to take courses from the DACC Dual Credit Approved Courses.
- DACC-Dual Credit student are only allowed to take "D" section courses (Doña Ana).
- DACC-Dual Credit students can only take summer courses as retakes to fix GPA (if any Dual Credit course was passed with less than a C-).
- DACC-Dual Credit students are only able to do retakes on the next semester if a grade of less than a C- is obtained for any current course. Students will be able to take new courses upon successful completion of these courses (C- or better).
